Voter Registration

 NEW! - Maine now has online voter registration at <u>Maine.gov/Vote</u> for all Maine voters

• You'll need either:

- A Maine driver's license or state ID; or
- Last 4 digits of your SSN AND a photo of your signature

Register as a Maine Uniformed Service or Overseas Voter (UOCAVA)

Use this online service if you are a UOCAVA voter and want to:

- Register to vote for the first time in Maine
- Provide updated information for your existing Maine voter registration
- Change your party enrollment

UOCAVA voters include:

- Uniformed Service voters who are currently living away from their Maine residence
- Overseas voters who are U.S. citizens currently living outside the United States and meet
 Maine residency requirements

Same-Day Registration

- Maine has **same-day registration**, so you can register at your polling place on Election Day.
- If you don't have all the documentation needed to register at that time, you can ask to vote a "challenged ballot". Even if you are not on the voter rolls, the election workers are required to allow you to cast this vote



Absentee Ballot Requests: Now Available

Ballots can be requested at: MaineDems.org/Absentee

Ballots can be returned:

- By **mail** (allow at least one week)
- In **person** at your town office or city hall
- To your **ballot drop box** if your municipality has one

Remember to sign the back of the envelope!

Ballots must be received by 8 pm on Election Day

Maine's Context: The Good

- Maine generally has very high registration rates and turnout
- Maine laws and policies around ballot access are some of the best
 - Same-day registration
 - Online voter registration
 - No-excuse absentees
 - In-person early absentees
 - No ID voting
 - Incarcerated Voting



Maine's Context, Continued: The Bad and the Ugly

- Students, immigrants, and other people of color are targeted by intimidation and disinformation
- There are policy challenges:

 Annual student re-registration
 Unclear residency proof requirements
- 500 clerks mean room for error and confusion from inconsistency
